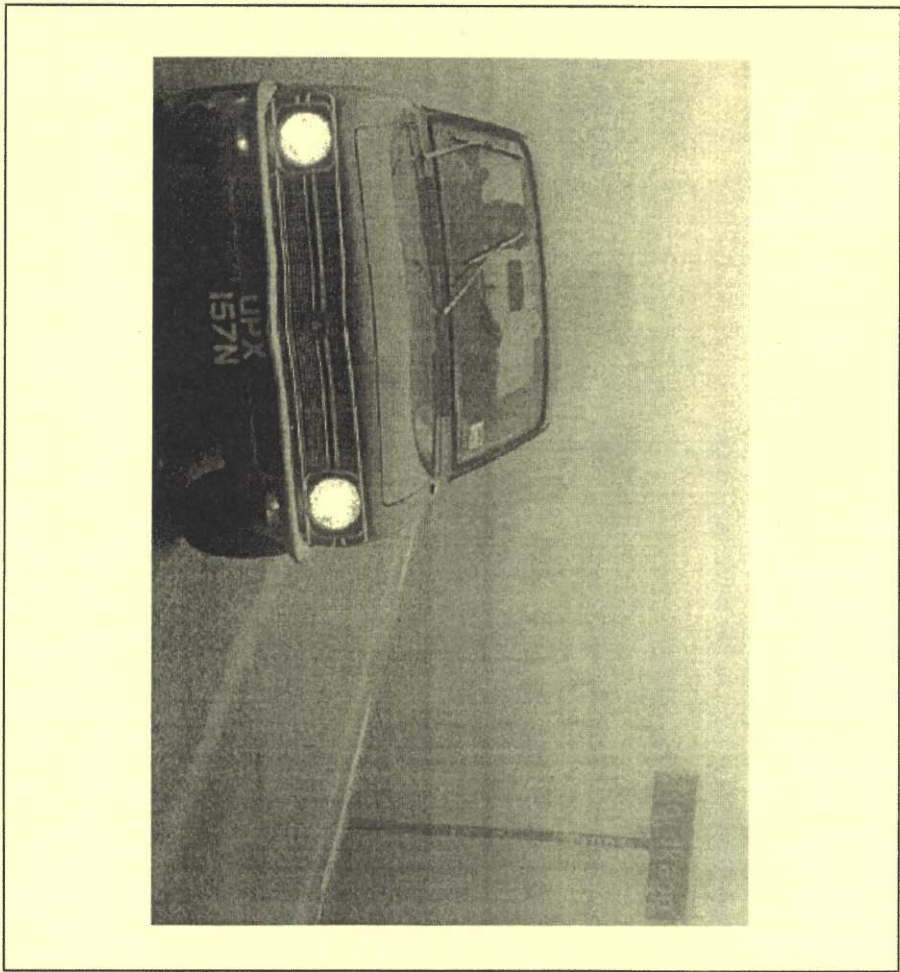

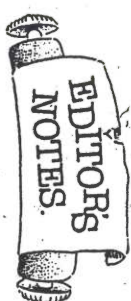

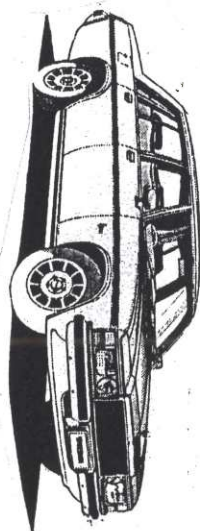

Holden may design the next Corvette.

According to a report in Automotive News, the design of the next-generation Chevrolet Corvette could come from one of GM's foreign studios. Holden's studio in Port Melbourne is one of those being asked to submit designs. Ed Welburn, GM's head of design, told the trade paper that he's asked for submissions from 10 different studios from around the world.

In the face of flagging sales GM needs to attract customers in Europe, as well as younger customers in the U.S. this is cited as one of the reasons for the worldwide competition.

Welburn also conceded that the interior of the Corvette needs redesigning in terms of materials and execution. He also suggested that the size of the Corvette could be trimmed down a little as a way of reflect its performance more.

It is expected that these designs would be for new Corvette which could be launched in 2013
